

## Develop theories

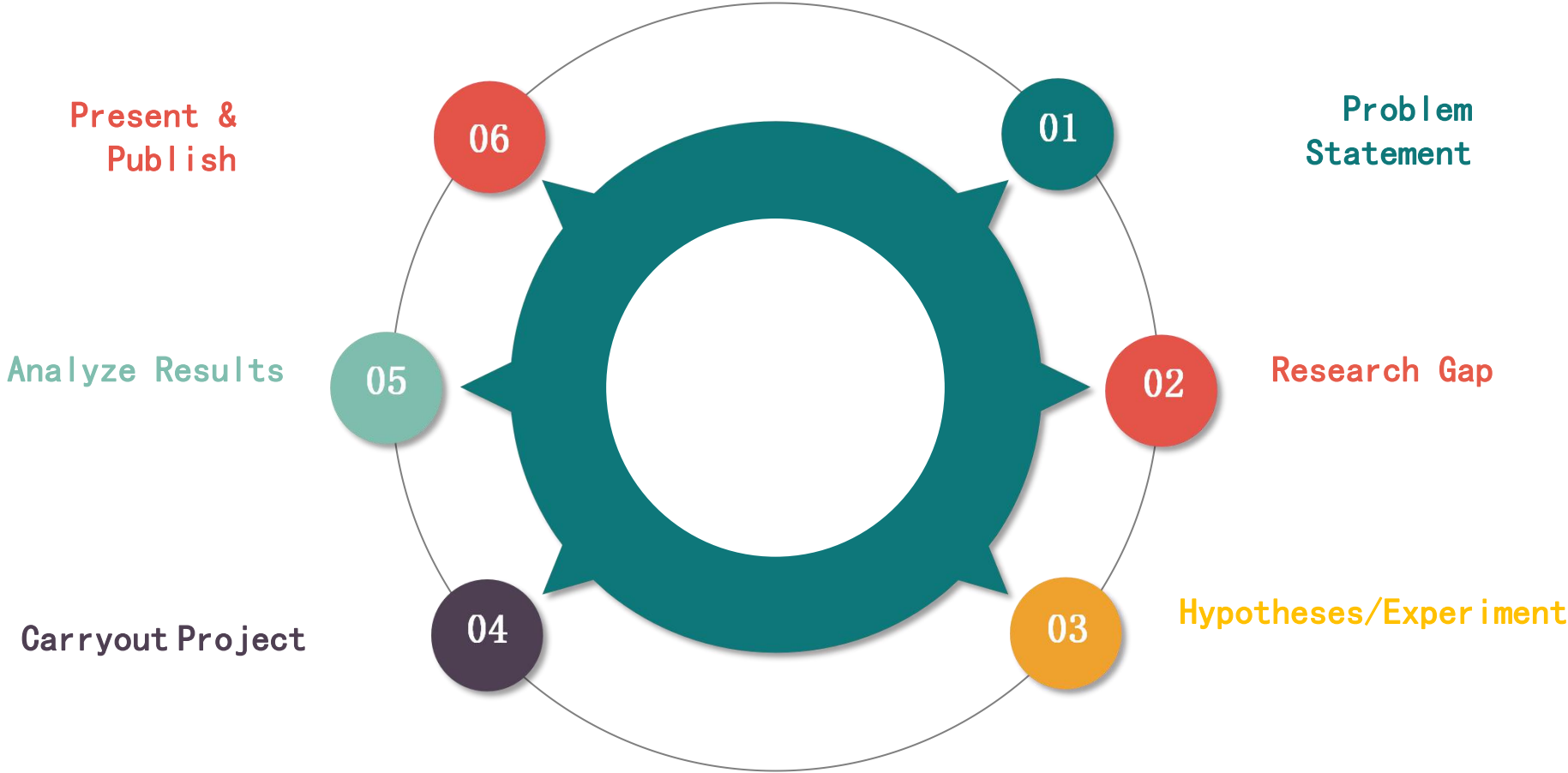
Explanation is the use of existing knowledge to give a new prospective to the current research

Research is a systematic application of a family of methods that are employed to provide trustworthy information about problems (Gay, 2000)

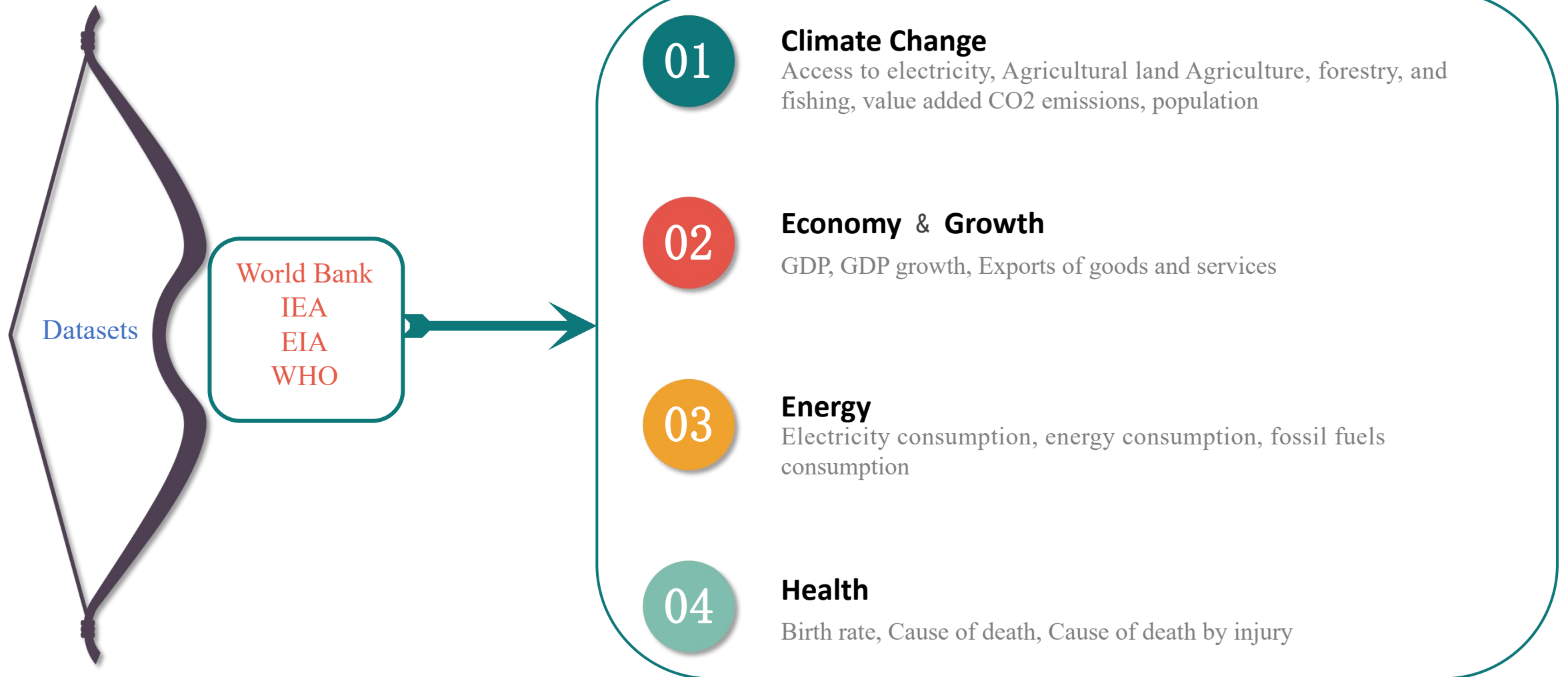

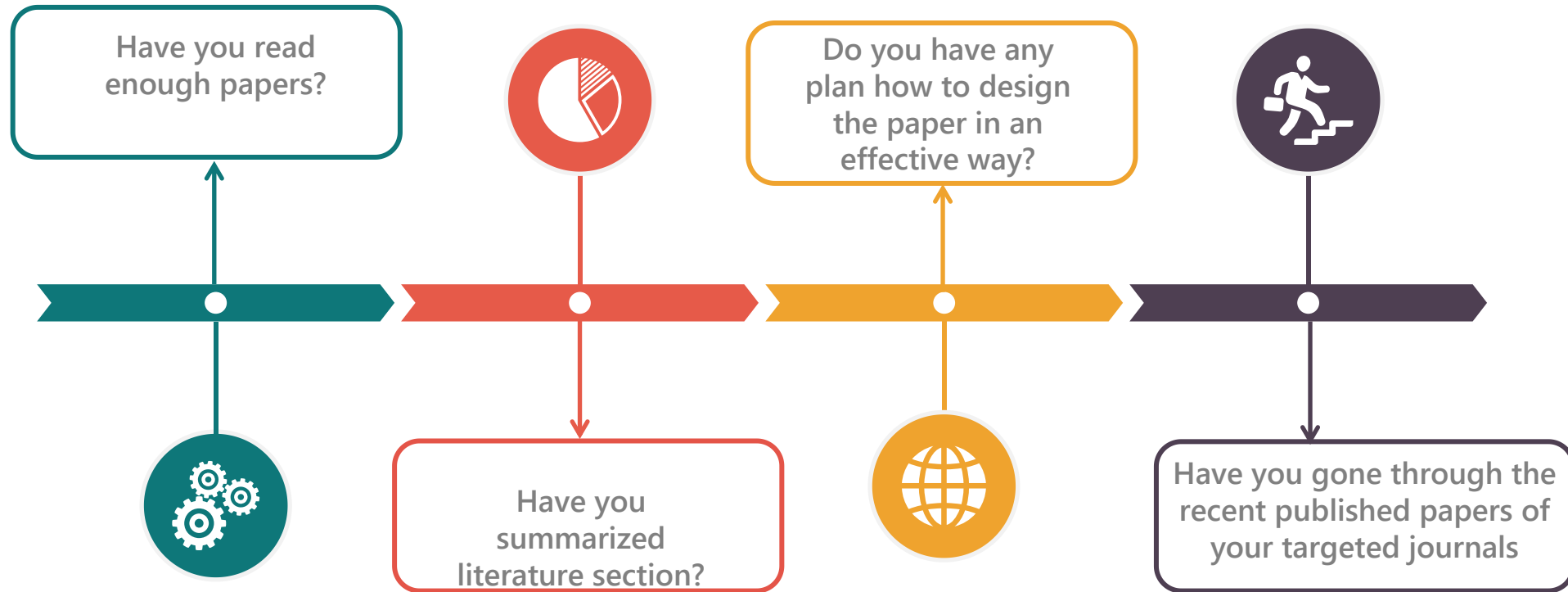

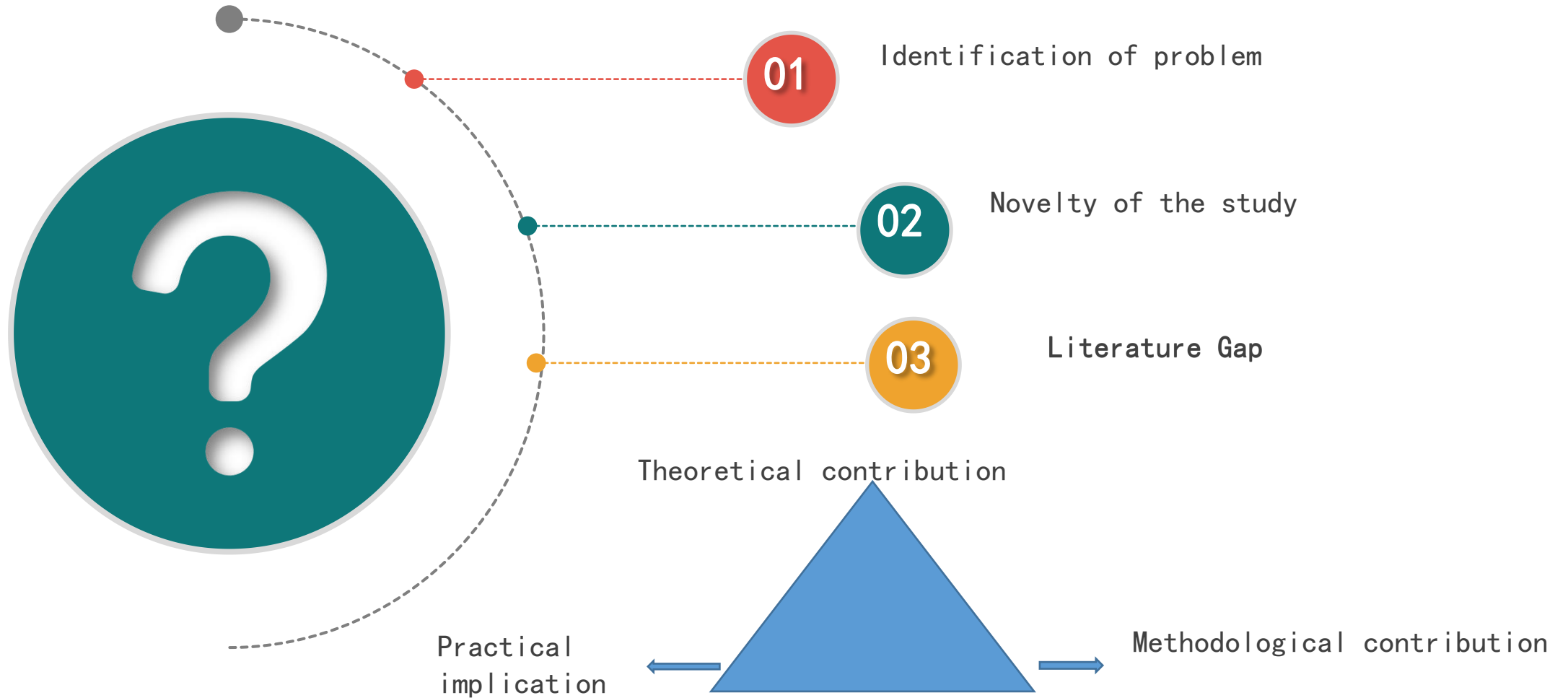

# Identifying research gaps

**Theoretical Gap**

The theoretical gap deals with the gap in theory with the prior research.

**Methodology Gap**

A methodological gap deals with the conflict that occurs due to the influence of methodology on research results

**Empirical Gap**

An empirical research gap deals with the research findings need to be evaluated empirically

**Population Gap**

The gap occurs when some of sub-populations have been un-explored.

# Important Factors of writing quality work

## **1. Coherence**

- Include all necessary information in each section
- Don't repeat information unless necessary (eg. Phrases)

## **2. Organization (structure)**

- The body of the paper (put the right parts in the right place)

## **3. Relevance**

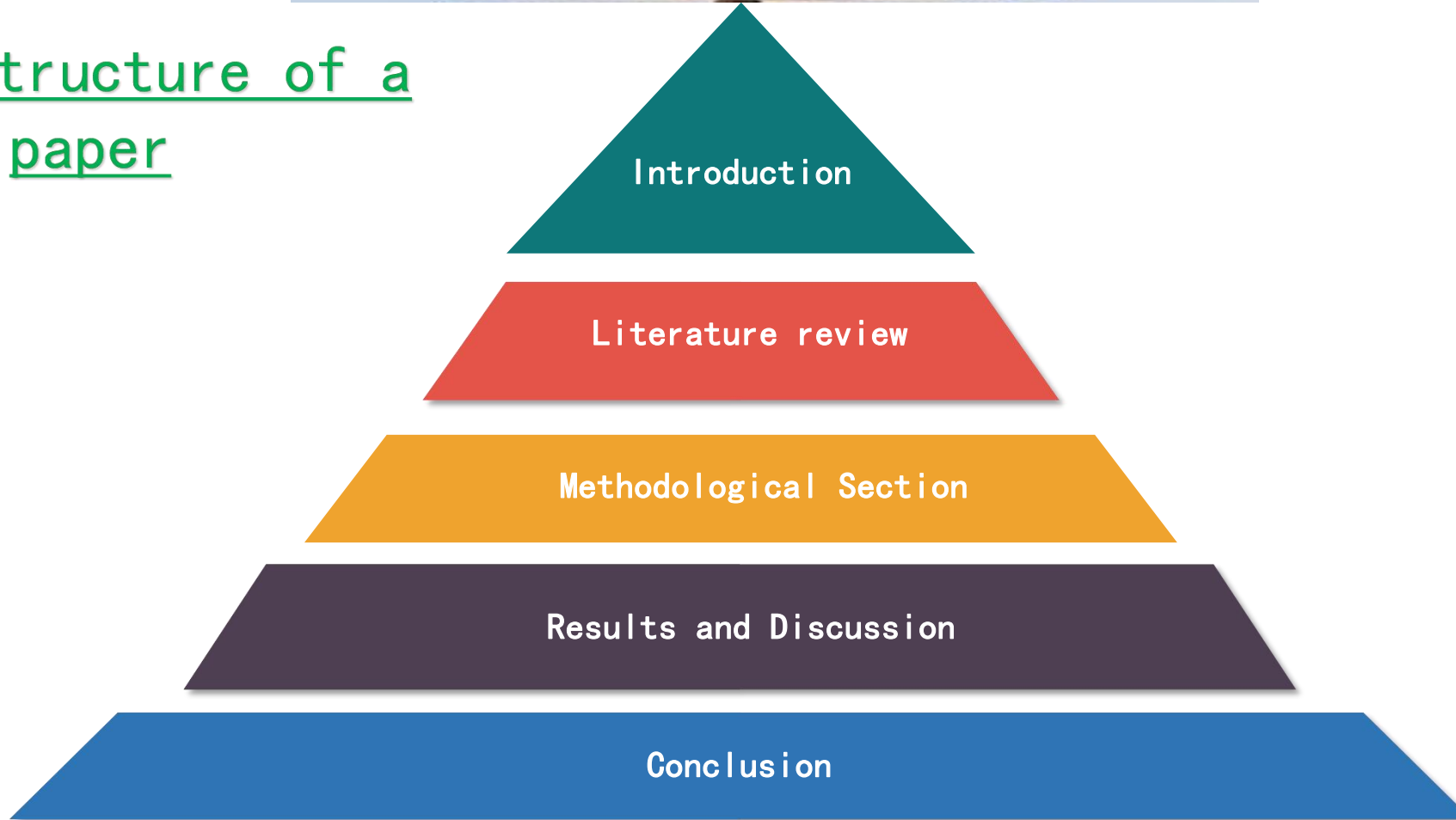
- Keep paper focused

## **4. Clarity**

- Should be easy to read and understandable

# Abstract of a research article

- **An abstract must be fully self-contained and make sense by itself, without further reference to outside sources or to the actual paper. Followed by a description of the existing gap, research method and design**
- **The major findings of the research**
- **Conclusions of the study**
- **Implications (optional)**

# Abstract of a research article with examples

## ABSTRACT

Small and medium enterprise (SME) competitive advantage has been recognized as an important topic for researchers dealing with SME internationalization. Previous studies have long discussed the role of firm competitive advantage as a determinant of international performance, but there are few studies analyzing the determinants of firm competitive advantage and its potential mediating role in the relationship between organizational capabilities and SMEs' international performance. In this paper, we hypothesize four essential export capabilities (market intelligence, product innovation, pricing, and marketing communication) as determinants of competitive advantage for exporting SMEs. Based on a sample of 119 active exporting Malaysian SMEs and using partial least squares (PLS) structural equation modeling, the results revealed that three of the mentioned capabilities lead to competitive advantage. In addition, results indicated that competitive advantage only acts as a mediator between pricing capability and SMEs' international performance. The main conclusions of this investigation can be valuable to SMEs and startups that intend to explore or exploit opportunities in foreign markets.

# Introduction section of a research article

## Writing Introduction section: 5 Ws'

- **Why** you choose that particular topic for research
- **Why** it is important
- **What** is already known and what is not known about your research work
- **Why** you adopted a particular method or approach
- **What** it contributes in the existing knowledge (Theoretical and practical contribution)



# Introduction section of a research article

- ❖ State the purpose of the work in the form of hypothesis, question or Problem you investigated.
- ❖ Briefly explain your approach, and whenever possible, provide outcome of your Study that can reveal.
- ❖ Introduction section must answer the question what was I studying and prove that This study will advance the knowledge of existing studies.
- ❖ Be sure to clearly state the research problem, research question and novelty of your work.



# Literature section of a research article

- **Search** for relevant literature
- **Provide** some background information (concepts, theories)
- **Identify** themes, debates and gaps
- **Outline** the structure
- **Summarize** the existing gap

- The data for this study was acquired from world Bank.
  - The two-way MANOVA is a multivariate analysis technique used for comparing one or more dependent variables across two or more than two independent variables. It allows us to look for differences across several dependent and independent variables.
  - First, there should be at least two or more dependent variables, and they need to be measured in interval or ratio level. The model has nine dependent variables mixed up of categorical, binary, and continuous in nature. Interestingly, SPSS Statistics software refers to those levels collectively at scale.
  - We used MANOVA due to the various reasons. First, our group of dependent variables consists of binary and categorical variables. Second, for MANOVA, there must be different groups and different outcome variables; our research considers a large number of samples, particularly focusing on multiple indicators related to health.

# Results section of a research article

- **Indicate how the approach fits the overall research design.** Your methods should have a clear connection with your research problem. In other words, make sure that your methods will actually address the problem. One of the most common deficiencies found in research papers is that the proposed methodology is unsuited to achieving the stated objective of your paper.
- **Explain how you intend to analyze your results.** Will you use statistical analysis? Will you use specific theoretical perspectives to help you analyze a text or explain observed behaviors?

# Results section of a research article

- **Describe the specific methods of data collection you are going to use**, such as, surveys, interviews, questionnaires, observation, archival research. If you are analyzing existing data, such as a data set or archival documents, describe how it was originally created or gathered and by whom.
- Data presented in tables, charts, and graphs, can attract readers.
- All data that corresponds to the central research question(s).
- All secondary findings (secondary outcomes, subgroup analyses, etc.)
- This section should be sufficiently expanded as it's the most important one explaining your work's new results.



# Conclusion section of a research article

## Examples

- **Start** the conclusion section with objectives/research question of the study
  - **Provide** summary of the results
  - **Explain** the importance of the results
  - **Suggest** implications/recommendations
  - **Summarize** the existing gap
  - **Recognize** the limitation of the study
- **The presents study was carried out.....**
  - **In this research, the goal was....**
  - **The** study has identified that .....
  - **The findings indicate that .....**
  - **This study** contributes to the existing knowledge....
  - **The empirical study** provides a new understanding of.....
  - **The results of our** study has an important implications .....
  - **Policymakers** and Government personnel should encourage....
  - **The study** only focuses on Pakistan.....

# Highlights (Mandatory in some journals)

- Highlights are **three to five bullet** points that help increase the discoverability of your article via search engines. It offer your paper a considerable advantage in the online world to the right audience.
- These bullet points should capture the **results of your research** as well as **new methods** that were used during the study
- Don't try to capture all ideas, concepts or conclusions as highlights
- Limit 80-85 characters

# Highlights (Some examples)

- MANOVA and OLS are employed to provide a robust analysis of the causal link
- A cross-sectional data of Pakistan, India, and Bangladesh are analyzed
- The type of cooking fuel affects the pregnancy and sterilization of a woman
- The place of cooking negatively affects age at sterilization of a woman

## Highlights

- The study uses a dataset of 701,834 households from six South Asian countries.
- It measures energy poverty with a multidimensional approach across South Asia.
- MANOVA is used to examine the causal relationship between health issues and MEPI.
- Most of the health variables have a statistically significant relationship with MEPI.

# Reviewer's comments and concerns (My paper)

## Reviewer's comments:

### Introduction:

- The manuscript claims to contribute both empirically and theoretically. However, it only states the empirical contribution, i.e., the application of a new method different from past studies. Please state all the contributions explicitly.
- How the selection of independent variables was made. This selection should be justified in that why some factors were included and others were excluded. (The relationship between dependent and independent variable).
- The paper should not solve a case, rather an issue should be the center of the discussion.

### Literature section:

- I highly recommend adding a comprehensive documentary to identify the research gap.
- I would also suggest building the argument based on a theory.

## Author's response:

- *Thank you for your comment.* The authors have explicitly defined the objectives, importance and novelty of work. *Please see paragraph # (lines....)*
- *Thank you for your constructive comment.* The authors have explicitly defined the explanation about the selection of explanatory variables. *Please see paragraph # (lines....)*
- *As per your timely instruction;* the authors have revised the literature section and added a paragraph that defines the working hypothesis. *Please see paragraph # (lines....)*

# Reviewer's comments and concerns (My paper)

## Reviewer's comments:

### Methodological section:

- The Methods and Data section should provide comprehensive information on the experimental methodologies, as well as the significance and novelty of the approaches in contrast to the existing methods.
- What are scientific contributions? From the methodological perspective, the authors should justify the current approach.

### Results and discussion section:

- I suggest citing and discussing some related studies in this section to justify your findings compared to past studies' findings.
- The results produced seem interesting. However, these do not seem to be compared to other results of this type produced elsewhere.

## Author's response:

- *As per your valuable suggestion, the authors have added a new paragraph in the methodological section that briefly explains the advantage of the machine learning approach, its differentiated role from other methods, and its use in our study. Please see paragraph # (lines....)*

# Reviewer' s comments and concerns (My paper

**Reviewer:** In such studies policy recommendations are critical. I recommend expanding policy recommendation sections
